



Money laundering regulations

Why do I need to prove my identity?

Since 1994, when the government introduced the Money Laundering Regulations, Ecclesiastical has been required to have procedures in place to prevent money laundering.

What is money laundering?

Criminals have to find a way of making the money they get from their criminal activities 'clean'. They try to launder their 'dirty money' by getting it into the financial system without detection or arousing suspicion. If they can get their 'dirty money' into the financial system they can then transfer it between different bank accounts or financial products in the UK or abroad, or use it to buy goods and services. The idea is to make the 'dirty money' appear to have come from a legitimate source. Criminals try to make it as hard as possible for the police to connect the money with its criminal past. The 'clean' money is often used to fund further crimes, including acts of terrorism.

So why am I being asked to prove my identity?

Criminals won't use their real name or address to buy financial products or services or open a bank account – it would be too easy to trace the money back to them. So, they use false identities and addresses. They may even try to buy a product or open an account using your identity. This is why Ecclesiastical wants to know you as a customer.

But Ecclesiastical knows me

You may wonder why, after having been with Ecclesiastical for many years, you are being asked to prove your identity. Ecclesiastical wants to take reasonable steps to find out about you as a customer. By checking each time you buy a new product, we are making sure that no one except you is using your identity.

What kind of identification does Ecclesiastical require?

You will need to show that you are who you say you are and that you live where you say you live.

Usually, the best documents to prove your identity are:

- your passport
- your driving licence
- your HM Revenue & Customs Tax Notification
- your Benefit book, or letter confirming benefits, from the Pensions Service, Department for Work and Pensions or job Centre Plus. This must be less than 6 months old.

The best documents to prove your address are usually:

- a recent local authority tax bill
- a recent utility bill
- a bank, building society or credit union statement or passbook
- a recent original mortgage statement, a local council rent card or tenancy agreement.

We will also accept confirmation from one of our financial advisers that they have visited your home.

The Money Laundering Regulations require Ecclesiastical to verify your identity and to keep copies of the documentation you give us. If it is not possible to verify your identity, then by law Ecclesiastical is not able to provide or continue to provide you with its products or services.

What's the Financial Conduct Authority's (FCA) role in combating financial crime?

The Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 (the Act) introduces a statutory objective to reduce financial crime. To meet this objective, the Act gives the FCA the power to make and enforce rules that apply to the firms they regulate. In particular, they can make rules to ensure financial services firms such as Ecclesiastical are not used for money laundering by terrorists and criminals. Also, the FCA's powers allow them to prosecute financial services firms if they do not follow the Money Laundering Regulations.

You can help prevent crime by:

- keeping your financial information and identity documents safe
- reporting any suspicions you have about financial
